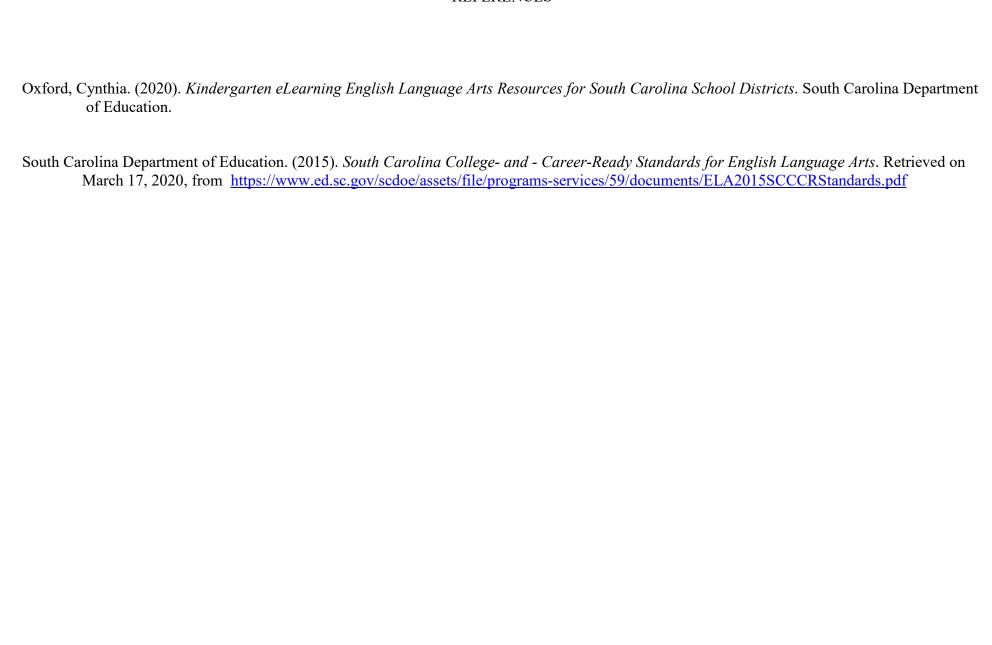
## Grade 4 eLearning English Language Arts Resources for South Carolina School Districts South Carolina Department of Education
