Note: These tasks were designed to be used in virtual/non-virtual settings. Students have opportunities to choose from the choice board or the teacher/caregiver may select the tasks for students by cutting and pasting the tasks into their own district’s learning management system. Regardless of delivery, teachers/caregivers should take time to talk about the task by asking questions such as, “Why did you choose the task?” “What does your response(s) mean?” and “Why does it matter?”

<p>Let’s analyze words, phrases, and sentences!</p> <p><b>Read a story and find your favorite <u>word</u>, <u>phrase</u>, and <u>sentence</u> from the story. Write the favorite word and sentence and tell why that word and sentence is your favorite. How do these words, phrases, and sentences help you with the meaning of the text?</b></p> <p>4.RL.9.5</p>	<p>Let’s create a presentation!</p> <p><b>Create a presentation based on a topic of your choice. Use a video, photos, or illustrations to support your ideas, thoughts, and feelings. Use credible sources.</b></p> <p>4.C.3.2</p>	<p>Let’s write a story!</p> <p><b>Think of a special day or event that you will always remember. What made it so special? Write a composition about that specific day or event and include sensory details, dialogue, action, and an ending.</b></p> <p>4.W.3.1</p>
<p>Let’s read and think!</p> <p><b>Read a story. While reading, stop occasionally and write down your thinking, using the following statements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The text says...</li> <li>• I say...</li> <li>• And so...</li> </ul> <p>4. RL.5.1</p>	<p>Let’s read and determine importance!</p> <p><b>Read a story and think carefully about the information you are reading. While reading, record the important <u>facts</u> and <u>questions</u> you may have, and your <u>response</u> to the facts and questions. Create a three-column chart to record your thinking.</b></p> <p><b>Facts- Questions- My Response</b></p> <p>4.RI. 6.1</p>	<p>Let’s write a persuasive paper!</p> <p><b>Write a persuasive letter about something that you want changed. Provide reasons supported by facts and details. Include a concluding statement or section.</b></p> <p>4.W.1.1</p>
<p>Let’s read!</p> <p><b>Read for 30 minutes any book you choose.</b></p> <p>4. RL.13.2 4. RI. 12.2</p>	<p>Find that figurative language!</p> <p><b>After reading a story of your choice, find examples of figurative language such as idioms, metaphors, imagery and hyperbole. Write the sentences and explain how the words connect with meaning.</b></p> <p>4. RL.9.1</p>	<p>Let’s write an informational book!</p> <p><b>What topic do you know a lot about? Create an informational book about your topic. Make sure you have facts, details, illustrations, a concluding statement or section, and illustrations in your informational book.</b></p> <p>4.W.2.1</p>
