

Students have opportunities to choose from the choice board or the teacher/caregiver may select the tasks for students by cutting and pasting the tasks into their own district's learning management system. Regardless of delivery, teachers/caregivers should take time to talk about the task by asking questions such as, "Why did you choose the task?" "What does your response(s) mean?" and "Why does it matter?"
