<p>The nest is soft and stretchy. She puts leaves on the outside. This hides the nest.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•</li></ul>
<p>The female lays her eggs when the nest is done. Each egg is the size of a pea. The nest is small, but it can grow. As the chicks grow, so does the nest.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•</li></ul>
<p>Hummingbirds make their nests in trees. Have you ever seen one? You have to look hard to find them. They are very small. They look like part of the tree.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•</li></ul>
