







A minute is a little bit of time. It is about as long as I can hold my breath.




An hour is a longer time. It is about as long as it takes me to do my homework.

- **1.** Fold a paper in half. On one side write "Hour" and on the other side write "Minute." Then under the word "Hour," draw a picture of something that takes about an hour to do. Under the word "Minute," draw something that takes about a minute to do.
- **2.** Using a piece of paper and pencil, see how many times you can write your name in a minute.
- **3.** Have someone help you set an alarm for one hour. After the alarm goes off, talk about all the things you did in that hour.
