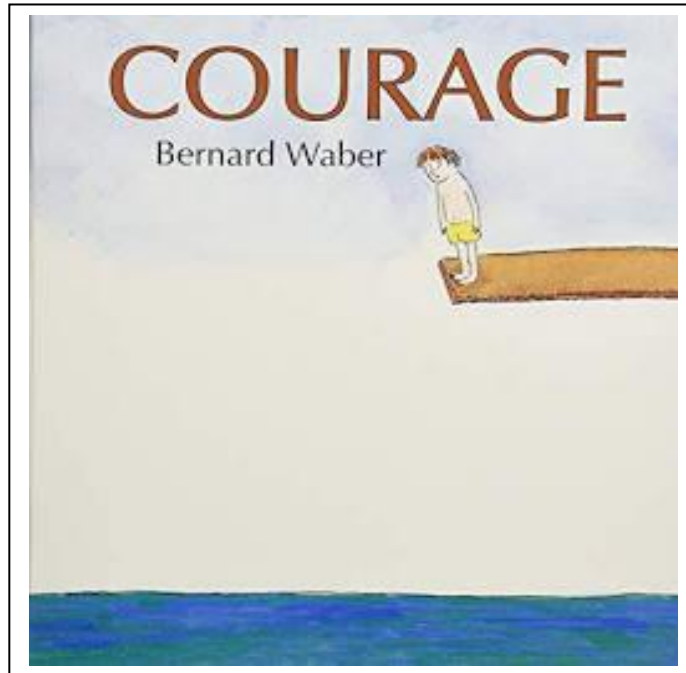


Courage: Many Kinds of Courage Day 1

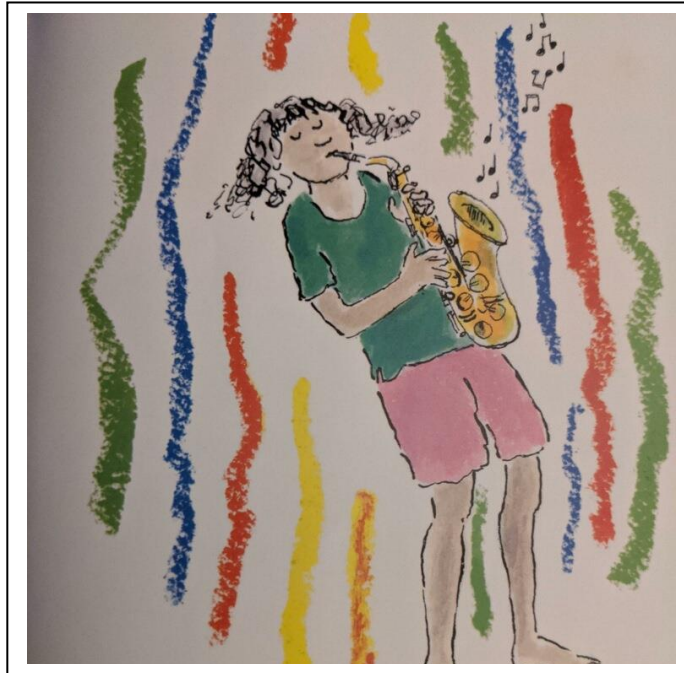

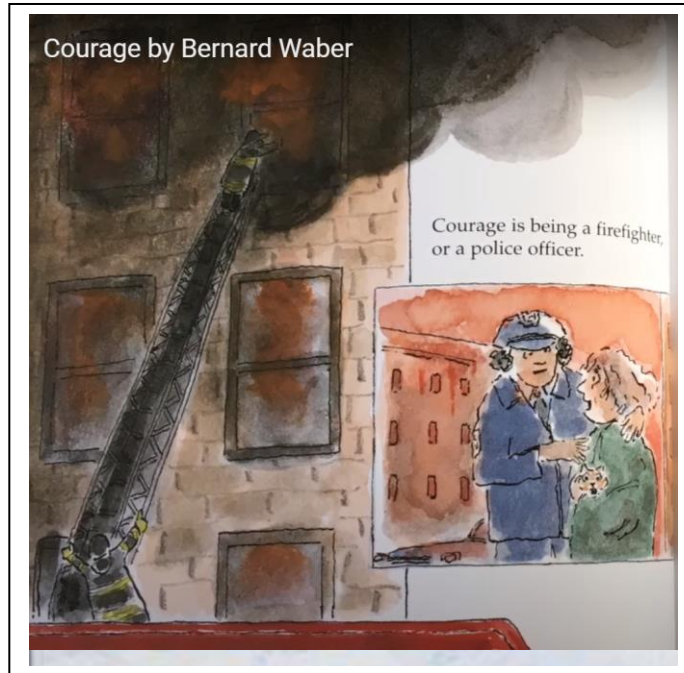
