### Daily Routines

Every day, I will...

- Read one of the nursery rhymes.
- Read a favorite book for 20 minutes.
- Practice the -ip and -it word family provided.
- Practice making the number 10 in different ways using the tens frame provided.
- Practice counting by ones on the number grid (1-100) provided.

Underline the sentence that tells you what the spider did after the rain dried up. Now color the picture of the spider.</p>	<p>Get a set of playing cards. Sort all the cards by number (2, 3, 4). Then sort all of the cards by shapes (heart, spade, diamond).</p>	<p>Our theme this week is being patient. Being patient means things like waiting for your turn. Play a game with a family member and practice waiting patiently for your turn.</p>
<p>Enjoy reading <i>There Was an Old Woman Who Lived in a Shoe</i> in a printable or digital version: <a href="https://youtu.be/oNuNHv4AlyQ">https://youtu.be/oNuNHv4AlyQ</a>. The old lady had lots of children. She fed them, gave them kisses, and put them to bed. Do you think she was patient? Why or why not. Tell a family member. Now color the picture of the old lady.</p>	<p>Practice sorting the laundry with your family. Sort the laundry by clothing type: shirts, shorts, bathing suits, rags, towels. Then, sort the laundry by colors: red, purple, blue</p>	<p>Being an artist takes patience and practice. Get some art supplies: crayons, glue, pipe cleaners, paint, sequins. Now, make your own art project and wait patiently for it to dry.</p>
<p>Think about a time you had to be patient. Draw a picture of what happened. Share your picture with a family member.</p>	<p>Find some counting materials around the house or in the pantry like blocks, beans, or cereal. Practice making a pattern with the shapes.</p>	<p>There is a story about Llama, Llama's first day at school, and misses his mama. Llama, Llama has to be patient until the end of the school day to see his mama. What did you do on your first day to help you be patient until the end of the day? Tell a family member all about it.</p>
