


Mr. Romano woke up at 4:30 each morning to do the chores on his farm.

After breakfast at 9:30, Mr. Romano always . . .




collected eggs from the henhouse.



Just before lunch at 11:30, Mr. Romano always fed the pigs.








At 3:00 in the afternoon, Mr. Romano and the dogs always herded the sheep into the small field near the barn.

He did not feed the pigs.




The sheep dogs waited in the shade and watched for him.




The animals were puzzled.
