Daily Routines:

★ Each day I will:

- **Reading:** Read a text of your choice for 20 minutes each day.
- **Writing:** Keep a daily journal. Writing an entry about a topic of your choice.
- **Math:** Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division math facts for 10 minutes each day! Create or print math fact flashcards.

3rd Grade Choice Board

Each day I will choose **ONE** activity in **Reading & Writing**, **Math** and a **Choice Area**.

Reading & Writing 	Math 	Choice Area 
Make a list of 5 words you want to learn to spell from your reading. Create graffiti words on a piece of paper using different letter designs and colors. Share with a family member.	Spend an hour outside. Record the animals you see. Draw a bar graph of the types of animals you saw and how many of each. Which animal did you see the most of? Which animal did you see the least of?	Make a list of five things you love about your family. Share your list with your family. Ask each of your family members to write a list of five things they love about your family, too.
If you could have dinner with one or more of the characters in your book, who would it be with and why? What questions would you ask them? Share your ideas with a family member.	Write down four random numbers. Using these numbers, create the smallest number you can. Next, create the largest number you can. Repeat the activity with four new numbers.	Create an exercise program for your family to complete. Write down step-by-step directions. Demonstrate each part of the exercise program and complete it together.
Think of a story that you read and loved. If you could jump in that story and live, which character would you be? Why? What would you do differently? Write about it.	Draw a right angle, acute angle, and obtuse angle on a piece of paper. Go on an angle hunt around your house. Find 10 right angles (90 degrees), 10 acute angles (less than 90 degrees), and 10 obtuse angles (more than 90 degrees).	Create a memory book of events that have happened since you started learning from home. What were the fun things you did at home? On each page of the memory book, draw a picture and write a description of the fun event. Share your memory book with your family.
Create a tweet of a story of your choice. Your tweet should include important events, but it can't be more than 140 letters!	When you read today, write down the start time and end time. Calculate how many minutes you read today. How many seconds is that?	Designate somewhere in the house for family members to leave positive notes for each other. Write down at least four sincere compliments for one member of your family.
Create a Venn diagram. Compare yourself to any character in a story of your choice. Share with a family member.	Which room in your house has the largest perimeter? Measure the perimeter in your footsteps.	Go on a walk as a family. At the end of the walk, each person should share the most beautiful thing they saw.
Write 3 facts you have learned from a non-fiction book you've recently read. Share the facts with someone that lives in your house.	Measure the length of your bed using 5 different non-standard units (paperclips, bottle caps, shoes). Record your answers.	As a family, think about your favorite songs. Choose a family theme song that you can begin and end your day listening and dancing to. Try it!
